A Middle Cities Enrollment Study will be done as part of the Facilities Enhancement Potential Project. The next media shoot for a commercial is tentatively scheduled for November 2<sup>nd</sup> and November 3<sup>rd</sup>. He also reported that he held a luncheon for all of the township supervisors, Project Empire was hosted at Westwood High School, and he recently met with a group of ten 12<sup>th</sup> grade students to discuss a variety of things about their high school career.

#### Aspen Ridge Elementary

Bryan DeAugustine reported for Chris Marana that the Fall NWEA MAP testing cycle wrapped up with a slight glitch in the technology for the fourth graders but overall went well. Fire prevention activities and Michigan Apple Crunch day will take place and Parent/Teacher conferences are coming up soon in November.

## Aspen Ridge Middle School/Athletics Report

Jon Beckman reported that the annual seventh-grade trip to Clear Lake Education Center saw the largest group wedye sent yet. The trip went very well and several people were noted in the thank you note that was shared with board members. Office visits for discipline are down compared to last year at this time. All middle school students attended an anti-bullying assembly at Ishpeming High School. In athletics, big congratulations to Chris Jackson and the girlsqtennis team for another UP title. This is the 9<sup>th</sup> title in 11 years. Fall sports are winding down. Westwood High School will host volleyball Districts as well as the Regionals for Class D.

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#### Westwood High School

Dave Boase reported that it has been a very busy school year with a CTE Safety Seminar, Homecoming, Young Americans, and the Big Sing all taking place. The excavation began for the CTE building site and the 11<sup>th</sup> graders will be taking the PSAT this week.

## **Special Education Report**

Nathan Longton reported that MARESA, through NICE Community Schools, wants to do a pilot program in the SCI classroom called Foundations of Communication. This program will focus on trying new and different technologies to support the communications needs of our students who communicate in different ways. The first LINKS celebration was held and there are currently five students signed up for the LINKS class and will receive credit for it.

#### Transportation

Bryan DeAugustine reported for Mike Wommer that the Michigan State Police Inspection will begin this week on Wednesday and the transportation staff is busy making sure everything is ready for that. The new buses are performing excellently.
