FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL: Tuesday, September 4, 2018 - FULL DAY

Hello NICE Community Schools Family and Friends,

Another summer draws to a close and another school year is about to begin. We are very excited about continuing our best traditions and launching some new initiatives. We are establishing a partnership with Northern Michigan University, MARESA, and a consortium of stakeholders in the UP to help establish a cyber range hub at NMU that will house a fantastic set of new opportunities for our students. A cyber range hub is a cybersecurity training platform that will allow students to learn cybersecurity skills, practice, train and gain industry recognized certifications and credentials. Our students will be able to examine and prepare for future career possibilities in this field.

We have seen the statistics that by the year 2020, there will be 20.8 billion technological devices that will need to be secure. Estimates suggest that 5 billion personal data records and \$8 trillion will need to be protected from cybercrime. Over 2 million jobs are forecast to be unfilled in the next few years in this field – many of which will not require college degrees and can be performed remotely. We want to offer our students the ability to prepare to be a part of the "New Collar" economy that is firmly established in Michigan and growing rapidly here in the UP. We are aware that well over half of cybersecurity candidates will need hands-on experience to pursue a career in this field. This cyber range hub initiative will be created in conjunction with significant industry partners like IBM and will open tremendous new paths to our students to explore these potential future careers. We are thrilled to be a part of this team and will be actively recruiting students to become engaged in these incredible opportunities. Stay tuned for upcoming details.

Also in partnership with Northern Michigan University, we are teaming up to help their Biology Department with a camera trapping initiative to study wildlife across the UP. Our students will be working with professors and students from NMU and the University of Michigan during this important study. This will give our students with an interest in biology and ecology hands-on experience with university-level research. Our partnership with NMU has been a cornerstone of pushing our educational programming to higher and higher levels. We are proud to be affiliated with such a fine university as Northern.

We will be embarking on these two exciting endeavors, along with many more, this fall. We cannot wait for our over 1,210 students to walk through the doors to continue our adventure. We are proud of our Patriots and their families. Welcome back and have a great start to the year.

You must present a valid drivers license as proof of age and residency at time of issue.

NICE START

KIDS CLUB

NICE Community School District Kids Club After School Program provides after-school activities and childcare for children in Kindergarten through 8th grade. Kids Club operates Monday through Friday from dismissal through 5:30 p.m.

The program will begin on Tuesday, September 4, 2018. Registration information will be available in the Aspen Ridge School Office and on the district website. The fee is based on the number of days children will attend. **All past due balances must be paid in full before we can accept your child's enrollment into the program.**

SCHOOL MEAL PRICES

The cost for school lunch will be \$3.00 per day for all K-12 students. Breakfast will be \$1.80 per day. Lunches have increased by 10 cents per day as a result of a requirement from the federal government to ensure that sufficient funds are provided to the food service account for paid lunches. Reduced prices remain the same (30 cents for breakfast and 40 cents for lunch per day). Milk is included with each meal served but all students can purchase additional milk for 50 cents per carton.

Aspen Ridge School Breakfast begins at 7:45 a.m. & Westwood High School Breakfast begins at 7:30 a.m.

Parents are encouraged to use the "Payschools" online option to pay for meals using a debit or credit card. Student account histories showing purchases and balances are available through Family Access. Payments will still be accepted in the school office in check or cash. Students will have the same pin numbers as last year.

In many cases, funding for programs and services in a district is based upon the free and reduced lunch count for that district. Please help us secure the maximum possible federal funding by completing a free or reduced lunch application form if you think you may qualify. You may fill out the form even if you do not plan to have your child take advantage of the school's lunch program.

FREE/REDUCED MEAL BENEFITS FROM LAST SCHOOL YEAR WILL END

Students and families who qualified for free or reduced price meals last school year (2017-2018) **MUST fill out a new application** for this school year (2018-2019). The free or reduced benefits from last year will only be carried-over until **Monday, October 15, 2018**. After that, if no new application is on file, meals will begin to be charged at full price. **The school will not send a reminder or a notice of expired eligibility.**

Applications will be sent home with each student on the first day of school. They can also be picked up at each school office or downloaded and printed from the district website: www.nice.k12.mi.us.

To avoid an interruption of benefits, don't forget to re-apply for free or reduced price meals each school year!

ONLINE LEARNING AT NICE

The Patriot Online Academy is a State of Michigan, accredited online public school that is FREE to students K-12. We provide the opportunity for students to enroll as a part-time or full-time student with the NICE Community School district. Last year, over 40 students in grades K-12 enrolled in more than 60 core and elective courses. All of the courses are aligned with Michigan standards and are teacher-led by our own local highly qualified instructors. Our local mentor, Scott Syrjala, who is also a certified educator, is available to help students and monitor their progress.
