#### SCHOOL MEAL PRICES

There will be no cost for school meals (breakfast & lunch) for all K-12 students this school year. Milk is included with each meal served but all students can purchase additional milk for 50 cents per carton. A la carte items are still available for purchase for students in grades 4-12 as long as they have money in their accounts.

\*Applications for free meals are still being sent home and we encourage families to complete and return them. A lot of funding for programs and services in a school district is based upon the free and reduced lunch count for that district. Please help us secure the maximum possible federal funding by completing a free or reduced lunch application form even though meals are free this year. You may fill out the form even if you do not plan to have your child take advantage of the school's lunch program.

#### SCHOOL BREAKFAST & LUNCH WILL BE SERVED OPENING DAY

Aspen Ridge School Breakfast begins at 7:45 a.m. & Westwood High School Breakfast begins at 7:30 a.m.

Parents are encouraged to use the <u>"SchoolPay" online option</u> to pay for meals using a card or e-check. Student account histories showing purchases and balances are available through Family Access. Payments will still be accepted in the school office in check or cash. Students will have the same pin numbers as last year. \*SchoolPay details are available on the district website.

#### **TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION**

The Transportation Department welcomes students back for the 2023-2024 school year. Below is the <u>tentative</u> bus schedule for 2023-2024. Students are required to arrive at their designated stop at least 10 minutes before the listed time and remain for at least 10 minutes after. All new incoming students will be provided a copy of the handbook on the first day of school. Please be aware that some of the buses are operating at or near capacity and bus passes will not be issued. 
