2025 VALEDICTORIAN AND SALUTATORIAN ANNOUNCED

Everyone is invited to attend the fifty-first (51st) commencement exercises at Westwood High School in the gymnasium on Thursday, May 22, 2025 at 7pm. Mr. Fran Sevegney, Class of 1995 Westwood High School Alumnus, will deliver the commencement address to the 103 seniors.
