SCHOOL MEAL PRICES

There will be no cost for a school breakfast and/or lunch each day for all K-12 students to begin this school year. *This may change as the year goes on depending on State and Federal programs and families will be notified if so.* Milk is included with each meal served but all students can purchase milk for 50 cents per carton. A la carte (grades 4-12) items and second meals are available for purchase as long as students have money in their Food Service accounts.

***Education Benefits Forms are being sent home and we encourage families to complete and return them. A lot of funding for programs and services in a school district is based on household income data collected for that district. Please help us secure the maximum possible federal funding by completing an Education Benefits Form even though meals are free to begin this school year. Please fill out the form even if you do not plan to have your child take advantage of the school's lunch program.**

Aspen Ridge School Breakfast begins at 7:45 a.m. & Westwood High School Breakfast begins at 7:30 a.m.

Parents are encouraged to use the **"SchoolPay" online option*** to add funds to their student accounts for purchasing a la carte item, milk, and second meals. Student account histories showing purchases and balances are available through Family Access. Payments will still be accepted in the school office in check or cash. Students will have the same pin numbers as last year. *SchoolPay details are available on the district website.

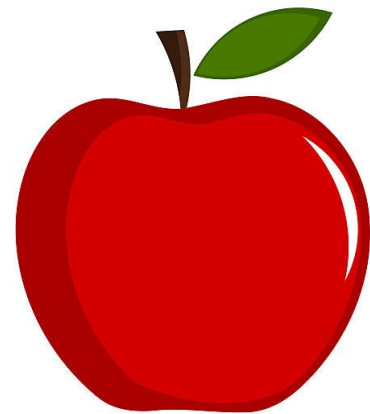


INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

If your family lives in any of the following situations:

- In a shelter
- In a motel or campground due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodation
- In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station
- Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

Your school-age children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act. Please contact the school office for assistance if you believe your children may be eligible.
